

Old Business:

New Building for ATA:

Phil will be leasing two buildings and there will be no financial responsibility for SLSP – Wardens will rewrite lease for ATA. SLSP is not responsible for any maintenance or repairs of the new or old buildings as follows.

<\$2000 ATA is responsible for any maintenance / repair

>\$2000 ATA and SLSP will split cost 50/50

Pledge Campaign: the giving envelopes have been ordered. These will be distributed this Sunday

Semi-Circle (Driveway): All vegetation will be removed and replaced with concrete. When Jose is available to do the work.

New Business:

Memorial Garden Walkway – Bill Durnick – has already replaced some of the stones but more permanent work will need to be done – when funds are available.

Memorial Garden – Future work - Replaced some of the wood on the island in center of the walk way in the garden.

Gate for Memorial Garden – Vestry voted and unanimously opposed the addition of gate to Memorial garden.

Thank you card / gift card for Bill Durnick for helping out - \$250 (Outback, Tractor Supply, Visa, etc.) Christmas Trees in the Church – All will be done December 14th.

Pete's Eagle Scout Project – Peter will build a Bench Swing that will be placed in the Memorial Garden **Warden Time:**

ERC – is no longer dead. Jason Ullrich signed a POA so that Scott can represent us with the IRS. Loan payment is due in January.

ACS – they tried to invoice Jason Ullrich for the remainer of the work. Jason asked them to send us signed permits before final payment will be made.




